

Are the story and/or illustrations too scary or upsetting?






- What are ways that you can bring the story to life?
- Are there foods, props, toys, puppets, etc., that you can bring to the reading that would help to capture the child's attention and imagination?
- Ask open-ended questions: "How is the character feeling?" or "What do you think will happen next?"
- Ask the child to talk about his/her favorite part of the story or favorite illustration.
- Is there a simple way to dramatize the story with family members, dolls, stuffed animals, etc.?
- Be prepared to read a good book over and over and over again!


Tuesday's snack was custom-made personal pizza.


