Until very recently, there have been no LDS missionaries in our city, but praise the LORD for an opportunity to meet and reach out to them.

in Belgrade

In August we had the opportunity to go to one of the weekly Bible studies in Belgrade. It was encouraging for us, as we pray for that outreach weekly. There are two married couples coming regularly, plus the adult daughter of one of the couples, and a couple of other people who pop in and out. Belgrade, the capitol of Serbia, has more than 3 million people, way fewer evangelical churches than Subotica, and many previous missionary attempts (by many groups) have been abandoned over the years. We were encouraged to see this little fellowship continuing steadily.

The Lord also blessed us with the ability to go to the Croatian coast for gathering before Bible study 11 days in August. We made it a combination of a vacation and a visit to our good friends, the Warholics, who are planting a church in Split. It's

our first real vacation since our honeymoon, and what a blessing it was to be by the sea, to have regular fellowship with such good friends, and to have a time of refreshing and rest at the end of a very busy summer and year. Dejan translated the Bible study the first Sunday we were there and taught the second. It was a joy to be able to serve our friends and serve alongside them for this time.
