BULGARIA' SAYS GROUP DESIRES NEW CHURCH

SOFIA, Bulgaria, Feb. 12 (UP)— Protestant ministers are negotiating with the Government to form a new "loyal" Evangelical council, Director of Cults Boris Iliev announced today.

The new patriotic council would replace that directed by the fifteen minis ers whose arrest was disclosed Thursday, Mr. Iliev, who is in charge of all religious activities in Bulgaria, said.

He said three Protestant delegations had visited him since the ministers' arrest in December to express satisfaction that "no obsach; had been placed in the way of Evangelical churches."

He said the wife of Vassil Zyapkov, one of the principal defendants in the forthcoming trial of the fifteen Protestant pastors for espionage, treason and black marketing, was among those active in preparing the new council.

Others who took part in the visiting delegations or who are otherwise working for "peaceful collaboration with the People's Fatherland Front," Mr. Iliev said, are:

Todor Shopov and Dmitri Sapondajiev of the Congregational Church; Peter Fortunov, Baptist; Mustafa Erberov, Methodist; Gruyo Kuzmanov, Pentacostal, and Boris Delchev, president of the First Sofia Evangelical Church, where Mr. Zyapkov served.
