Bulgaria Rejects U. N. Bid to Join Religious Parley

Sofia, Bulgaria, April 27 (U.P.).—Bulgaria today rejected an invitation to participate in United Nations General Assembly discussions of religious freedom.

In a cable to U. N. Secretary-General Trygve Lie, Foreign Minister Vasil Kolarov said the trial of Protestant pastors in Sofia last

month was an internal affair.

The Bulgarian note followed a similar rejection four days ago by Hungary.

The government announced that Bulgarian orthodox, Moslem and Jewish church leaders last night cabled Lie that churches in Bulgaria were "enjoying complete freedom."
