Russian Pastor Tells of 'Horrors' Under Soviet Rule

"Horrors" endured by a Christian minister and his family under the ; Soviet government in Russia were described last night by Paul Voronaeff at a group meeting in the Kendall Baptist Church.

Young Voronaeff, whose parents, he said, are now in a Siberian concentration camp, came to the United States a year ago. Two brothers had paid a ransom for his release, he asserted.

Claiming to have passed through a "living hell" in four Soviet prison camps because of his religious convictions. Voronaeff has lectured throughout the country under the sponsorship of the Association of Christian Youth movement.
