2004 has began with the addition of two new players, Stefan Ward and Richard Wilson. We also have the pleasure in welcoming back Mick Whitmore from Kibworth.

#### **Pre-Season Friendly**

Saturday 17th April saw the first match of the season for the club, a 12-a-side friendly against Old Wyverians. There were also three players in their side that also play for N&LCC, so fifteen players from both first and second teams had a run out on a bright but breezy day.

Batting first N&L soon lost opener Paul Julian and Simon Francis joined Neil Young. who hit an unbeaten 50 and was retired by captain Neil Whitmore on 61. Karl Eddington then preceded to smash the ball to all parts of the boundary, finally being bowled just short of his half century. Neil Whitmore then joined Simon Francis who had started to open his shoulders and was retired on 64. The innings was brought to a close by Richard Bray and Dave Wray with the N&LCC total standing at 224 for 2 after 40 overs.

After a tea provided by Patsy Whitmore, Narborough took to the field and opened the bowling with new player Richard Wilson from the motorway end and Paul Thompson with the wind from the potato field end. A spell of tight bowling and two catches from Paul Julian soon had the visitors in trouble. Wickets fell at regular intervals but resistance from Ryan Wakeling towards the end of their innings meant that the Old Wyverians finished on 100 for 8.

The major presentation of the evening was The J E Briers Memorial Rose Bowl. This is awarded annually for outstanding service to the club and is in memory of Ted Briers a past Chairman. This was first presented in 1965 to Tony Rogers and was won the following year by Len Briers, son of Ted. It was nice to have Len present at the Dinner to hand over the trophy to this years winner, Simon Francis. Simon played his first senior match away to Earl Shilton on 27th June 1979. He has been playing ever since at Senior level and has been in recent years Promoter of the very important 100 Club.

Simon made a short response in which he stated how honoured he was to be awarded this trophy , a typically modest response from Simon.

#### **MATCH REPORTS**

#### 24TH APRIL FIRST XI AWAY AT IBSTOCK

Batting first, Narborough made 188 for 5 in their 45 overs with Carl Bateman top scoring with 52, Neil Whitmore 42 not out. Ibstock were bowled out for 174 with Paul Warrington and Alan Wakeling returning figures of 3 for 41 and 3 for 42 respectively.

#### 24TH APRIL SECOND XI AT HOME TO ASHBY HASTINGS II

On a gloriously hot first day of the season captain Neil Young lost the toss and was asked to bat by the opposition. This must have been a decision they soon regretted as Paul Julian and Neil Young put on 69 for the first wicket before Julian was dismissed for 22. A second wicket stand of 56 with Mick Dunne and 74 with for the third with Rich Key (44) and Ashby were up against it. Young was finally bowled for exactly 100 and the innings closed on 257 for 5.

Ashby began their reply slowly against the opening attack of Chris Hall and Paul Thompson. Wickets fell on a regular basis and Stefan Ward, making his league debut, took 4 for 26. Andy Jackson took 3 for 18 and Rich Key 2 for 3. Most notable piece of fielding being a mid air right handed catch by Eddie Crouch at mid-on. Ashby were eventually bowled out for 107 to give the second XI the best possible start to the season.

#### IST MAY FIRST XI AT HOME TO ASHBY HASTINGS

Again batting first, Narborough made 205 for 4 with Mick Whitmore scoring 111 not out and Simon Francis 32.

Ashby Hasting first team faired little better than their seconds the week before. As they hung on for a losing draw, making just 149 for 9. Best bowling was by Rich Cooper who took 3 for 27. Alan Wakeling and Chris Armitage took 2 for 26 and 2 for 29 respectively. It was a shame that the last pair hung on at the end but the winning draw still bought 19 points for the first XI.

#### SECOND XI AWAY AT EGERTON PARK

A damper and colder venue for the second XI this week and on losing the toss they took to the field and restricted Egerton Park to 148 for 6, Rich Key having the best bowling of the day with 4 for 58.

Unfortunately, the reply was slow and with a rash of wickets between overs 10 and 20 meant that they were always up against it. N Young top scored with 41 and Stefan Ward made 19 at the end of the innings including two sixes. Alas the damage had already been done and when Ward was bowled Narborough had made only 130, disappointing after last weeks start.
