Ocean Nutrition fixes plant

Ocean Nutrition Canada, the maker of a fish-oil-based dietary supplement, has spent \$4.5 million to get its plant in Arcadia, Wisc., back into full operation after a fire last October.

Ian Lucas, the firm's vice-president of global marketing, said the fire started in the spray-dryer portion of the micro-encapsulation plant just a few months after production began.

The company bought the former milk plant in February and spent several months upgrading it.

Although the fire destroyed the important spray-dryer portion of the building, the company will maintain production by contracting out that part of the process to Sun-Opta.

Stora Enso growing in China

Stora Enso will borrow up to \$300 million to expand its operations in China.

In a recent release, the company said it has signed a new loan agreement with Internatio Corp. that will allow it to focus on profitable expansion in China by "prioritizing local susta supply" and targeting investments in the market and product sectors.

Stora Enso has had a paper mill at Suzhou since 1996.
