October is the month that we honour Mary by praying the Rosary Please feel free to use the following as a guide when praying the Rosary. 4,<u>5</u>,6 The Rosary is divided into five decades. Each decade represents a mystery or event in the life of Jesus. There are four sets of "Mysteries of the Rosary" (Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful, and Glorious). These four "Mysteries of the Rosary" therefore contain, a total of twenty mysteries. The Joyful Mysteries First Joyful Mystery - The Annunciation of Gabriel to Mary How to Pray the Rosary Second Joyful Mystery - The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth Third Joyful Mystery - The Birth of Jesus Begin at the tail end of the rosary beads Fourth Joyful Mystery - The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple Holding the crucifix "In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit" one Apostles' Creed Fifth Joyful Mystery - Finding Jesus in the Temple On the first bead: The Luminous Mysteries First Luminous Mystery - The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan On the three grouped beads The Second Luminous Mystery - The Wedding at Cana, Christ Manifested one Hail Mary on each bead On the next single bead: The Third Luminous Mystery - the Proclamation of the Kingdom of God one Glory Be The Fourth Luminous Mystery - The Transfiguration of Jesus Many people ignore the tail and begin at this point. The Fifth Luminous Mystery - The Last Supper, the Holy Eucharist The first mystery Announce the first mystery. For example, the first The Glorious Mysteries luminous mystery is the baptism of Jesus First Glorious Mystery - The Resurrection of Jesus On the same single bead as above: one Our Father Second Glorious Mystery - The Ascension of Jesus Move on to the loop of beads Third Glorious Mystery - The Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost On the first set of ten beads. one Hail Mary on each bead (total of ten) Fourth Glorious Mystery - The Assumption of Mary into Heaven Pause and reflect on the first mystery Fifth Glorious Mystery - The Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and On the single bead: one Glory Be Earth The second to the fifth mysteries The Sorrowful Mysteries Announce the mysteries one at a time and repeat the pattern of First Sorrowful Mystery - Agony of Jesus in the Garden one Our Father ten Hail Marys Second Sorrowful Mystery - Jesus is Scourged at the Pillar one Glory Be until you have reflected on all five mysteries Third Sorrowful Mystery - Jesus is Crowned With Thorns Conclude each series (set of five mysteries) with Fourth Sorrowful Mystery - Jesus Carries His Cross Hail. Operation Christmas Child


Our Lady of Lourdes will be participating in this project again this year.

October 5 – 11, 2008 It's Fire Prevention Week – **Prevent Home Fires**

Preventing the leading causes of home fires – cooking, heating, electrical and smoking-materials - is within your power. Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period time, turn off the stove. Keep anything that can catch fire - potholders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper or plastic bags - away form your stovetop.-Keep

lamps, light fixtures, and light bulbs away from anything that can burn, such as lamp shades, bedding, curtains, and clothing. Replace cracked and damaged electrical cords. Maintain heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional. Keep all things that can burn, such as paper, bedding or furniture, at least 1 meter away from heating equipment. Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet, out of the reach of children. Wherever you smoke, use deep, sturdy ashtrays.

Fire is fast, extremely hot and spreads rapidly. It creates thick black toxic smoke that is even more deadly than flames! When fire strikes, seconds are important! There is no time to stop and think. Everyone needs to know what to do! Smoke alarms provide the early warning of the problem and a home fire escape plan will provide time to escape safely. Although we hope you never have to use it, planning and practicing your home escape plan may one day save your life and the lives of your loved ones.

The fire service has again partnered with local schools to teach children and their families the importance of installing and maintaining working smoke alarms and developing and practicing a home fire drill. Children will learn these skills by completing an interactive fire safety worksheet - Fire Safety Starts with You!

The Office of the Fire Commissioner targets grades K – 3. The brochure "Fire Safety Starts With You" will be distributed to all children in these grades. Each child is eligible to win a home computer system by entering the draw.

Westside Fire Rescue will be holding Kids Day at the Fire Hall on Sunday, Oct. 5, 2008 from 12:00 – 4:00 pm at the fire station located at 3651 Old Okanagan Hwy., Westbank, BC. There will be a number of fun activities for the children to participate in. Sparky the fire dog will be there and refreshments will be available. Each child will be given a goodie bag to take home. Please plan on attending this great event!
