The PDF Watermarker for Mac OS X

You can quickly add or remove watermarks to any PDF document:

1. Drag in a PDF file (or use Open...)
2. *To stamp text:*
 - In Info, type in your string or choose one from popdown
 - Select your font, size, color and **Underneath** or **Over**
 - Drag the text around until you like its positioning
 - Click "Add stamp" to view if auto update is not on.
 - Choose "+" from popup to add more lines of text

To stamp an image:

- Drag in a TIFF, JPEG, GIF, etc.
- Move it to where you want it
- Choose **Underneath** or **Over**
- Click "Add stamp" to view if auto update is not on.

To stamp both:

- Chose "Both" and follow instructions above

3. **Save...** to stamp your existing document

TIP: use **Save As...** to create a new document

TIP: If you need to redline or add arbitrary marks to any one or more given pages - then get Create® from www.stone.com - Not only can it do PDF markup, but also newsletters, page layout, graphic illustration, autotracing, image conversions and even make web pages!

"Why does **Underneath** not work with some PDF?" - ' **Underneath** can only work if the PDF page description does not erase the page (paint the page area over in white) during the drawing of the text and graphics. This depends on the application you use to create the PDF or (in the case of PS 'distilling' programs like PStill) the way the application created the source PostScript. The underlying mark is there, painted before the main PDF page description, but it will get overdrawn in white. **Over** marks are not affected however as these paint last.
